GRISELDA MEETS THE MUSIC

Saluzzo (Italy), 6-8 November 2015



The mythical figure of Griselda, wife of Gualtieri, Marquis of Saluzzo, and a protagonist of the last novel of the *Decameron* by Giovanni Boccaccio, has inspired over the centuries a considerable number of literary, dramatic and pictorial responses. Among the composers who represented her character in their operas are Apostolo Zeno (who set his story in Sicily), Antonio Pollarolo (1701), Tomaso Albinoni (1703), Fortunato Chilleri (1706), Giuseppe Maria Orlandini (1716), Antonio Maria Bononcini (1718), Alessandro Scarlatti (1721), Giovanni Bononcini (1722), Pietro Torri (1723), Niccolò Porpora (1724), Francesco Bartolomeo Conti (1725), Antonio Vivaldi (1735), and Gaetano Latilla (1751). The caracter was also introduced in the libretti for operas by Antonio Predieri (1711), Nicola Logroscino (1752), Niccolò Piccinni (1793), Pietro Carlo Guglielmi (1795), Ferdinando Paër (1798), Federico Ricci (1847), Adophe-Charles Adam (1848, ballet), Georges Bizet (1871, sketches), Giulio Cottrau (1878) and, finally, Jules Massenet (1901). The conference will focus on the musical approaches to the character of Griselda, including references in iconography, scenography, and libretti.
